POSITIVE WELFARE


In science, and society at large, there is a growing interest in positive experiences for animals. However, there is little agreement on how to define or assess positive animal welfare scientifically.

COST Action LIFT

COST Action LIFT (CA21124) is a research network which aims to provide the scientific background for including positive welfare in farm animal welfare assessments, through cross-discipline knowledge sharing, training and collaboration.

OUR APPROACH

- Interdisciplinary working groups, incl. researchers in animal science, neuroscience and social science
- Networking meetings, to discuss and write review papers
- Training schools to teach methods related to positive animal welfare to young researchers
- Short-term Scientific Missions, to increase research collaboration across countries
- 3 working groups, to define key concepts of positive animal welfare (WG1), identify valid methodologies to assess it (WG2), and devise potential on-farm indicators (WG3)


